Curtis' problems began immediately with complaints coming from married student housing. (Details enclosed) Counseling followed. (Details enclosed) Academic struggles and lack of effort in tutoring and classroom attendance are noted from SAAS.

Every person in control in the athletic department in the last two years has been contacted by Curtis' wife and her mother. These calls threatened Curtis and the University of Washington with actions personally and legally concerning his contact with his family, child support and other personal matters. They have also contacted the local press in these attempts to get to Curtis.

As you can see from the amount of problems, socially, academically, and athletically, we feel it has been in Curtis' and the University's best interest for him to no longer be a part of our program.

**CURTIS WILLIAMS**

Summer of 1996, complaints were made in regards to excessive noise that appeared to be fighting between Curtis and his wife, at their residence in married student housing. University Campus Police is where the complaint was filed.

The second complaint was filed at the Seattle Police Department. SPD received a complaint from a neighbor of Curtis and his wife. A phone call was made by SPD to Coach Lambright in regards to serious problems between Curtis and his wife, Michelle. Subsequently, Curtis and his wife were removed from the married student housing program.

Curtis was ordered to go to counseling. Those counseling meetings were scheduled during practice times. Curtis was given permission to attend these meetings. After checking Curtis' attendance, it was found that he had missed two-thirds of these assigned counseling appointments.

June of 1997, Curtis was arrested for assault following an altercation with his wife. Curtis spent two and one-half months in the King County Jail. During this time, Curtis missed his finals and had to hardship withdrawal from his classes.

Curtis pleaded guilty to a Class C felony assault due to the altercation. The court placed a no-contact order on Curtis. Curtis was ordered not to have contact with his wife and his child.

After getting out of jail Curtis planned on transferring. Curtis moved back to his home town of Fresno, where he planned on attending Fresno State, but after two weeks of being home, Curtis returned to Seattle and to the University of Washington.

During the fall of 1997, Curtis resumed his relationship with his wife, Michelle, breaking the No-Contact order that was placed on him by the court. During the 1997 Fall academic quarter, Curtis missed numerous class and tutoring appointments. Due to his poor performance, he withdrew from all of his classes.

December of 1997, Curtis moved back in with his wife Michelle. This was a direct violation of his No-Contact order. January, 1998, Curtis reported to his parole officer for the first time. At that meeting, he was arrested and placed in jail for breaking his No-Contact order. Curtis spent the next three weeks in the King County Jail.

Curtis was released by the judge on the recommendation of Coach Linehan and Coach Milus. The judge put strict guidelines on Curtis' behavior. Under the conditions the judge set for Curtis, he was to be monitored daily by the coaching staff. All counselling appointments had to be attended and Curtis was ordered to stay away from his wife Michelle and their child. Following this judgement, Curtis has stayed away from his wife, but his class and tutoring attendance remained very inconsistent.
