### PATHOLOGICAL DIAGNOSES:

- 1. Perforating gunshot wound of chin.
  - a. Entrance wound: Right side of chin.
  - b. Involving: Subcutaneous tissue just beneath the skin.
  - c. Exit wound: Left side of chin.
- 2. Perforating gunshot wound of right arm.
  - a. Entrance wound: Posterior upper right arm.
  - b. Involving: Arm with exit and reentry into chest wall.
  - c. Involving chest.
  - d. Exit wound: Right subclavian area.
- 3. Perforating gunshot wound of right chest.
  - a. Entrance wound: Right chest above nipple.
  - b. Involving: The lungs and heart.
  - c. Exit wound: Left axilla.
- 4. Perforating gunshot wound of right forearm.
  - a. Entrance wound: Proximal anteromedial right forearm.
  - b. Involving: Subcutaneous tissue and musculature of anterior and lateral forearm and distal upper arm.
  - c. Exit wound: Lateral aspect of right upper arm.
- 5. Contusion abrasion of lower right chest.
- 6. Hepatic steatosis.
- 7. History of chronic ethanolism.

#### OPINION:

This 50 year old male died as a result of multiple gunshot wounds sustained in an officer-involved shooting. The manner of death is homicide.
