For the past two years I have been employed by the South Kitsap school District as an intermediate level teacher at Olalla elementary.

Olalla is a rural school located in the township of Olalla, Washington. The school caters basically to farming, military, lower white, and blue collar children. The school is multi ethnic with large numbers of Indians and asians.

My specific assignment has been at the fourth grade level. But because of the school's leveling program I have worked with students in math and reading whos abilities range from lower second to high sixth. Aside from the normal instructional and planning (curriculum development etc.) duties at my level, I have also taught physical education to grades one, two and four; model rocketry and art to grade six; wire sculpture in evening classes; and intramural soccre, baseball, football, floor hockey, and track during lunch recess.
