Player lounge
At 38 feet by 29 feet, it can handle 25 players for meals.

Mariners' lockers
There are 44 lockers, enough to accommodate the expanded 40-man rosters of September. They are assigned by seniority, with some players getting two each. The 4-foot-wide cubicles are made of cherry and ash by a Mount Vernon millworks. The lockers include shoe shelves, lockboxes, overhead storage units and an electrical outlet.

Communication centers
Two supporting beams are camouflaged by cabinetry with mail boxes and modem connections. 60-inch TV screens are mounted above the cabinets.

Weight and cardiovascular-activity rooms
Both home and visitors' sides have spacious workout rooms.

Sick room
Private area to sequester an under-the-weather player.

Training room
54 feet by 39 feet, with seven tables.

Hydrotherapy room
With a custom-designed tub, three whirlpool baths and a therapy pool. The tub has 240 jets to soothe muscle injuries.

Batting cages
The Mariners have two subterranean batting cages. The visiting team has one.
